Location

Puna: expansive with a growing population, lacks infrastructure like roads, utilities and healthcare services. ASC is the home of the Hawaii Academy of Arts & Science Public Charter School (HAASPCS).

Demographic

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP): all students have access to free breakfast and lunch on school days - low socio-economic indicators.

Our Purpose

Providing out standing support & infrastructure for community-based learning, rooted in Puna, Hawai'i

Threats and Hazards

- Lava Zone 2 surrounded by Zone 1 (East Rift) and Zone 3 Currently there is only one direct road out of Puna Makai (Hwy 130) and NO coastal access such as a boat ramp on the Puna coastline. Earthquakes are common.
- Climate Change (including more extreme weather from hurricanes to droughts)
- Loss of Utilities & Resources (Communication, Fuel, Water, Food, et ...)
- Limited Mobility (Access Roads, General Transportation, Health Care)
- Limited Health Care Access
- Limited Education and Networking Opportunities

Needs Assessment

Transportation Solutions: Ex: Ride Shares, Public Transportation including the proposed Transportation Hub in Pahoa, Emergency Access Routes

Emergency Resources: Ex: Emergency Room (closest are in Hilo and Kau) & Medical Facilities (2 small clinics in Pahoa and Fire Dept. with ambulances that must use one, usually clogged road into Hilo), Food & Supply Storage & Distribution, Evacuation sites

Economic Support: Ex: Rezone Puna to Allow for 'Ohanas and 'tiny / portable' homes

Community Enrichment: Ex: Rebuild the Poho'iki Boat Ramp, Active Programs to support growing food at home and in neighborhoods

Educational Resources: Ex: More Schools, Training Opportunities

In the next 12 months (April 2023-March 2024), our Hub Team will:

- Install Weather-Resistant 8x20 Office for Storage and Program Support.
- Install a Generator on Main Campus Dedicated to IT Support, Charging, etc.

 - Website to include links to Ready.gov for personal safety planning at home, in neighborhoods and community
 - ASC Resilience Hub Volunteer base and communication plan
- Semi-Annual Festivals to Celebrate Gifts Present in Our Community
